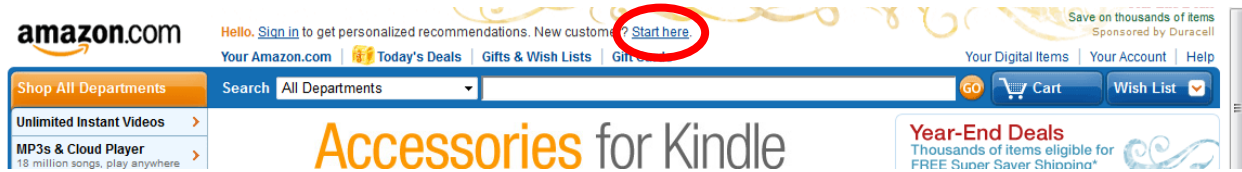
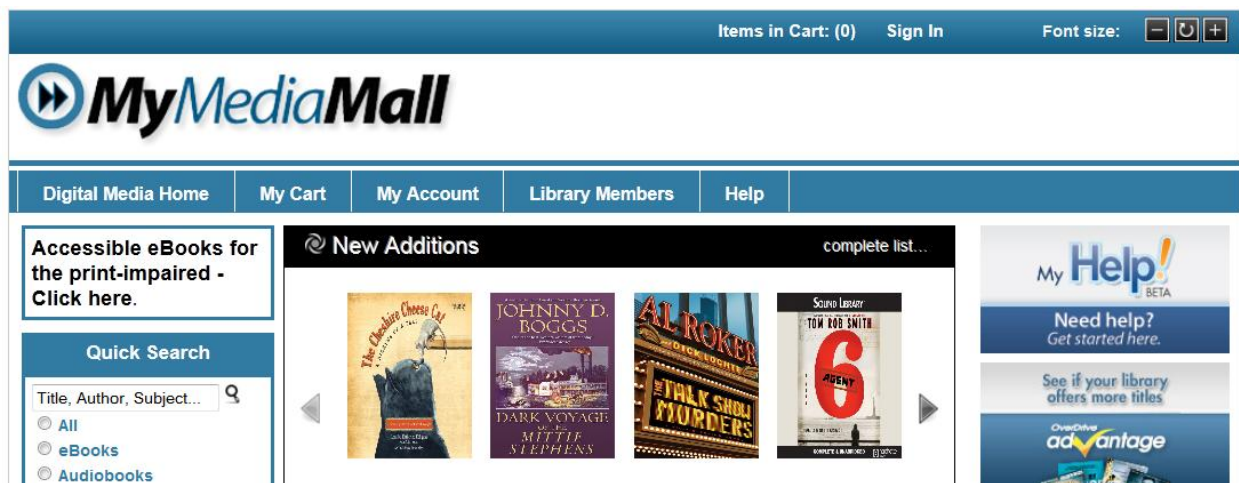


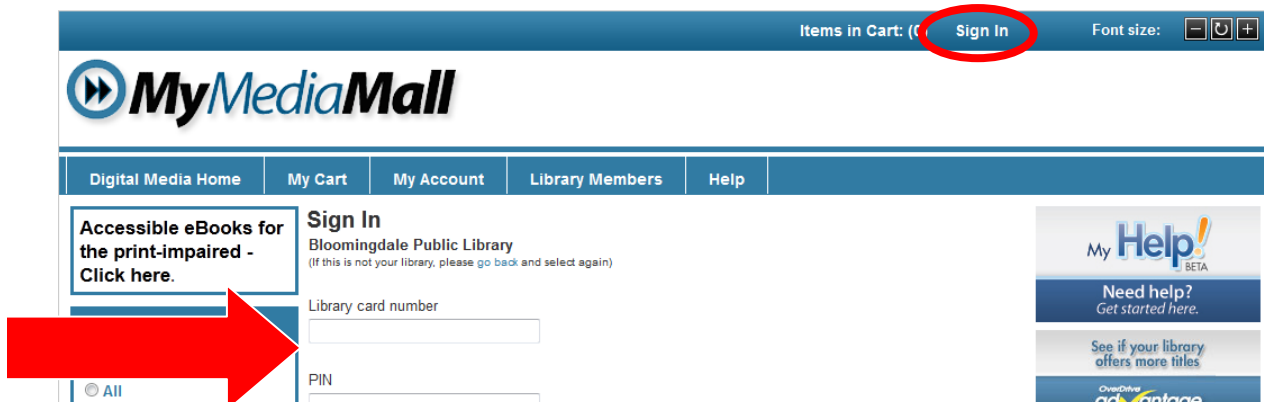
1. If you don't have an Amazon.com account, please visit [www.amazon.com](http://www.amazon.com) first and create an account. This is required for downloading library eBooks. Click the [Start here](#) link to begin creating your account.



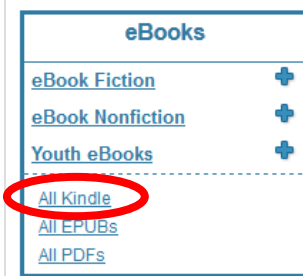
2. Once you've made your Amazon account, you must register your Kindle (if you haven't already). To register your Kindle, select **Menu** on the Kindle and then select **Settings**. Select **Register** and input your Amazon.com account username and password.
3. Visit the MyMediaMall website to begin browsing the Library's Kindle books. [www.mymediama.net](http://www.mymediama.net)



4. Click on **Sign In** at the top, select Bloomingdale Public Library from the drop down menu, and then enter your Library card number and PIN at the prompts.



5. Once you are logged in, you can search for Kindle books. Scroll down to the left side of the screen under eBooks and select All Kindle.



6. Alternatively, you can select Advanced Search and limit your selections to the Kindle Book under Format. You can also check the box above the search button to limit your Advanced Search to only show titles with copies available. Please be aware that this will limit your search results significantly.


13. Select your Kindle device from the drop down menu and select Continue.



## Frequently Asked Questions

### Why isn't my library eBook appearing on my Kindle?

First, check your Kindle and make sure you are connected to a Wi-Fi network. If you are connected to Wi-Fi and the eBook still isn't appearing, select the Menu button on your Kindle and then choose Sync & Check for Items. The book should appear on your home screen.

If you have a Kindle Fire, tap the battery/Wi-Fi icon in the upper right hand corner of the screen. When the menu appears, tap Sync. The book should appear on your home screen when it finishes syncing.

### Why is this book not available for Kindle from my local library?

Availability of books and the loan period will vary by library. Additionally, some publishers do not currently work with libraries to offer eBook loans, so their titles are not available.

**How do I send library books to my Kindle device or reading app?**

Once a public library book has been checked out, you can send it to any registered Kindle device or reading app from the Manage Your Kindle page. Public library books require an active Wi-Fi connection for wireless delivery to a Kindle device. Library books will not be delivered via your Kindle's 3G connection. If you don't have an active Wi-Fi connection, you may instead load your library book via USB. **What eBook formats will work on my Kindle?**

For public library eBooks, only Kindle formatted books will work with your Kindle. EPUB and PDF books are not compatible with the Kindle.

**Why can't I wirelessly transfer Penguin Books to my Kindle?**

Due to recent changes in the agreement with the publisher Penguin Group, Kindle users that download Penguin titles from MyMediaMall will not have the option of transferring titles wirelessly. Users will have to connect their Kindle to a computer and manually transfer the file over via USB. Amazon's transfer page ([www.amazon.com/kindletransfer](http://www.amazon.com/kindletransfer)) provides step by step instructions.

**Will I be notified before my public library book loan expires?**

Yes. Three days before the end of the loan period, Amazon will send a courtesy reminder email about the loan expiration. Once the loan period has ended, an additional email notification will be sent.

**How do I view the status of my loan?**

You can view the status of a public library book for Kindle from the [Manage Your Kindle](#) page. Click on the "+" symbol next to any title to view more details about any book that you've borrowed including the expiration date. You can also access all of the materials that you currently have checked out on the Library's MyMediaMall website at [www.mymedimall.net](http://www.mymedimall.net).

**What Kindle devices can I read public library books on?**

You can read borrowed Kindle books on any generation Kindle device or all free Kindle apps, as well as in your web browser with Kindle Cloud Reader.
