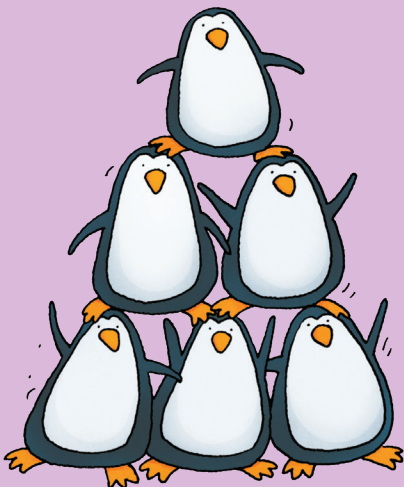

3D Print Services



3D printing is the process of taking a digital design file and turning it into a physical 3D object.

You can download premade designs online or create your own designs, and then print them out. Bloomingdale Public Library owns two 3D printers, and we use plastic PLA filament to print. PLA filament is an environmentally safe, biodegradable plastic.

3D Print Services are 50¢ per 1/2 hour of printing.
