the Donna Beth Froio Cultural Collection



The Youth Services Department houses a special collection called the
Donna Beth Froio Foreign Language and Cultural Collection.

The collection began in 1982 with a generous donation by Mr. Dominic and Mrs. Barbara Froio in memory of their loving daughter Donna Beth, who died at the age of 16. The interest from these invested funds is used each year to purchase new items.
