On June 9, 1975, the **Bloomingdale Public Library (BPL)** opened its doors in a 1,600-square-foot mobile classroom, housing 4,500 adult and juvenile books. Over the past five decades, BPL has grown significantly through multiple referendums, renovations, and a commitment to continuous improvement. Today, we add new materials daily and boast upgraded HVAC systems and modernized washrooms.

On behalf of the Library Board and Staff, I warmly invite all Bloomingdale residents to join us in celebrating 50 years of exceptional library service. Our expanded facility now offers a vast array of materials, programs, and amenities, reflecting our growth alongside the community.

While much has changed, the dedication of BPL's staff to providing outstanding materials and programs remains unwavering. A 2024 community survey revealed a 93% satisfaction rate, a testament to our efforts. Our elected Board of Trustees drives BPL's success by setting budgets, policies, and future plans.
