Henry Hitzeman, 75, of 492 Laurel St., Elgin, died Thursday in Sherman Hospital, Elgin. Born April 23, 1895, in Ontarioville, he was the son of William and Willamena Neimeier Hitzeman, and was a lifelong Elgin resident. He was employed at the Elgin Corrugated Box Co., of Elgin for 42 years before retiring in 1961. He served with the US Army during World War I, and was a member of the Elgin American Legion Post 57. Surviving are the widow, Alice R. Torrey Hitzeman; four sons, Richard A. and Raymond G., both of Elgin, Robert L. of Michigan, and Russell of Carpentersville; a step-daughter, Mrs. Margene Manowski of Clinton, Conn.; two brothers, Martin and Edward Hitzeman both of Elgin; a sister, Mrs. Charles (Bertha) Jacobs and 11 grandchildren and four great grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents, a brother, William and a sister, Mrs. Mathilda Zimmer. Funeral services were at 1 today in Wait-Ross-Allanson Funeral Chapel, Elgin, with the Rev. Glenn G. Gilbert, pastor of the Holy Trinity Lutheran Church officiating. Burial was in Bluff City Cemetery.
