

To Hold Wiesneth Funeral Saturday

Cloverdale – Funeral services will be held at 9:30 am Saturday at St. Isidore's Catholic Church for George Wiesneth 82, who died at his home Tuesday. The Rev. John Ott will officiate. Burial will be in St. Isidore's Cemetery. Mr. Wiesneth, a retired farmer, farmed a half-mile southeast of Cloverdale from 1911 to 1932, when he moved into the village. He was born Oct 8, 1862, in Neidarndorf, Germany, and came to this country in 1889, the same year in which he married Margaret Bratting, who also came from Germany. They were married Nov. 18, 1889, in Bensenville. Twelve children, 10 of whom survive, were born to this union. Mrs. Wiesneth, thirty grandchildren and two great grandchildren also survive. One grandson, Cpl. Oscar Stark, was killed in World War II, last Jan. 19, in France. The children are Joe of Elmhurst, Frank, George and William, all of Cloverdale; Otto of Louisville, Nebr.; John of Vallejo, Calif.; Mrs. Anna Steil of Aurora; Mrs. Rose Stark of Cloverdale; Mrs. Rose Fiedler of West Chicago; Mrs. Barbara Randecker of Bloomingdale. Two sons, Michael and Paul, died in 1925 and 1935 respectively. Mr. Wiesneth was a member of St. Isidore's Church. Friends may call at the Wiesneth home from this evening until the time of the funeral Saturday.
