Literacy Tips

Use simple props such as a stuffed animal to tell a story. Use silly voices for different characters and ask your child to join in.

Play together! Many activities are great for developing motor skills and hand-eye coordination that children need for writing.

Let your child experiment with writing utensils such as pencils, crayons, markers, and chalk. This encourages them to make scribble-like strokes that will later help in forming letters.

How long does it take to reach 1000 books?

1 book/day - finish in 3 years

3 books/day - finish in 1 year

This is an ongoing program. The only requirement is that you finish before your child starts kindergarten. There is no rush!

Reading Milestones

Once you've read 100 books, bring your reading record into the Youth Services desk for a special reward. When you hit the 500 and 1,000 book milestones, you'll receive a larger prize.

How does it work?

- Any child residing in Bloomingdale is eligible from birth to the day they enter kindergarten.
- Sign up on our website or in person at the Youth Services desk.
- Each time you read a book with your child, record your progress on your reading log or on our website.
- Books we read at BPL storytimes, books read in preschool, audiobooks, and eBooks all count toward 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten. You can also count books you read over and over again!
- Come to the Youth Services desk regularly to celebrate your progress!
